#### RECOMMENDATIONS FOR A SCHOOL-WIDE FOUNDATION OF LEARNING SUPPORTS:

**“Formal policies and practices to  
assess and strengthen parent and  
family involvement”**

*West Virginia Expanded School Mental Health Steering Team, 2011*

Strong parental involvement with schools is associated with academic achievement, regardless of socio-economic status or parent education. At the school level, practices that promote family engagement include:

- A welcoming environment—friendly signs welcoming families and visitors
- Standards of welcoming behavior that apply to all staff
- Programs and activities that engage families in promoting student achievement (e.g., student work displayed throughout the building, workshops, learning kits and other activities to show families how to help their child at home);
- Strong relationships between teachers and families—frequent opportunities to meet face to face; teachers making personal monthly contact via phone;
- Activities to develop families’ self-confidence (e.g., inviting families to be involved in planning, a school that is open and accessible);
- Professional development for families and staff: opportunities to learn together.
- Frequent and clear communications with parents about services and supports through the student handbook, website and parent orientations.
