# Cynthia Keely, BA, RRT, LRTR - West Virginia Bureau for Public Health, Department of Health and Human Resources

Cynthia Keely, a native of Charleston, West Virginia, is the Manager of the Asthma Education and Prevention Program, a program funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, located in the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources. Among her duties as manager, Ms. Keely directs initiatives to achieve the goals of the State Plan for Addressing Asthma in the state in the hopes of improving the lives of those suffering from asthma. These include providing evidenced-based asthma education and trainings, leading awareness campaigns, and partnering with other state agencies, non-profits, health care facilities, and communities. As a licensed registered respiratory therapist, Ms. Keely also provides acute care and educational needs at a major medical facility in Charleston, WV. In fact, she continues to care for patients ranging from neonatal to the senior population in her nearly two decade career. Also, Ms. Keely served eight years as an enlisted soldier in the West Virginia Army National Guard. During her military tenure she received the Meritorious Service Medal, the Army Achievement Medal, and an Honorable Discharge for her service. Ms. Keely received her Bachelor of Arts Degree from Marshall University in Huntington, WV.
